Elections matter!! Over the past two years, Sojourner Center has experienced drastic budget cuts due to state revenue shortfalls. Additionally, many of the services that victims of domestic violence utilize to improve their lives and attain safety and self sufficiency – childcare, TANF, GED classes, affordable housing – have been reduced or eliminated, limiting the opportunities available to them. We can change the direction by becoming informed voters and this guide has been created to support you in doing just that.

In this guide, you will find election resources, contact information for all of the candidates, and suggested questions that you can ask candidates regarding domestic violence and what they will do about it if elected. All information listed is specific to Maricopa County. If you are in another county, check with that county's elections department. Last day to register to vote: Monday, October 4, 2010

Election Day: Tuesday, November 2, 2010 – 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Early voting: You can vote early at the Maricopa County Elections Department, beginning October 7th – 111 S. 3rd Ave., M-F 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (other sites listed at <http://recorder.maricopa.gov/elections/evlocations.aspx>). For anyone concerned about safety, early voting is a safe alternative, and there are usually no lines. You will need ID – see below.

Voting by mail: Request a mail-in ballot by calling the elections department, or going to <https://recorder.maricopa.gov/earlyvoteballotnet/evbrequest.aspx>. There is also an option to sign up for the Permanent Early Voter List. Early ballots must be requested by October 22. Make sure to read the instructions that come with your ballot to ensure you complete the ballot correctly and **YOUR VOTE IS COUNTED!** Also make sure to get it in on time. If you haven't mailed it by October 29, you can hand deliver it to any polling place on Election Day.

Voting at the polls: All registered voters should receive an election pamphlet/sample ballot from the Maricopa County Elections Department. Your polling location will be listed here. If you do not receive this, you can find your polling location here:

<http://recorder.maricopa.gov/pollingplaces/pollingplace.aspx>. However, if you have moved and haven't re-registered, you will need to go to your old polling place, or cast a provisional ballot at your new polling place. You may be required to show proof of residency at this address. All voters will need ID at the polls – see below.

Required voter identification: You do not need to show identification when you vote by mail. You will need to bring ID to vote in person. The address on your ID **MUST MATCH THE ADDRESS ON YOUR VOTER REGISTRATION**. Here is ID that is accepted:

With photo, name and address (1 required)

- Valid AZ driver license or nonoperating identification license
- Tribal enrollment card or other form of tribal identification
- Valid US federal, state, or local government issued ID

OR Without photo, but with name and address (2 required)

- Utility bill dated within 90 days
- Bank statement dated within 90 days
- Valid AZ vehicle registration
- Indian census card
- Property tax statement
- Tribal enrollment card or other form of tribal identification
- Recorder's certificate
- Valid US federal, state, or local government issued ID, including voter registration card issued by the county recorder

What district(s) am I in?

Ballot Measures

There will be 10 propositions on the General Election ballot. Registered voters will receive an official publicity pamphlet from the Secretary of State, which contains the official language of the propositions as well as statements submitted by interested parties in support or opposition of the measures.
